

Quarterly Parent Information Meeting Check List

Initial Steps:

- Inform school Administrator (Principal) of the date/time for the Parent Information Meeting
- Notify via e-mail all Principals and 1010 directors affected.
 - (Email reminder from Marisela and Director will be sent).
- Submit Reservation Form for Facility used on site (Specialist)
 - Send a copy of Reservation form to Marisela to be documented as proof of submission

After Date & Location Have been confirmed:

- Book entertainment from school and invite all the parents of students performing
- Post information in marquees, principal newsletter and office.
 - Hang big poster advertising parent quarterly meeting
- Check with school parent groups or Title I (community rep) for food for families.
- Place meeting information on website.
- Submit meeting information to post in Community calendar in city calendar events (Daily Star Events).
- Inform TUSD Media Support of event (Jess Ruvalcava).
- Invitations to parents labels planned and mailed by print shop (Student Equity)
- Set up Parent Link for phone calls.
- Contact Luis Orantes for translators. Complete all forms.
- Talk & Listen Kits for translating (Obtain paperwork from Teresa Guerrero, Title I Starr Center).
 - Complete the paperwork for talk and listen kits at least two weeks before meeting.
- Collect and contact all community agencies that are willing to set up a table at resource fair.
 - Contact Ward I Congresswoman Regina Romero's office to see if they wish to share information in agenda.

Quarterly Parent Information Meeting Check List

Create the Agenda:

- Agenda – Consult with Specialists, community agencies and Director, speakers and presenters.
 - Check to see if presenters will need internet access
 - If so, immediately verify if meeting location has access
- List all resources that are attending the session in the agenda.
- Agenda must include the following: Department programs/services, ALE Video, Magnet Programs, TUSD Stats, Data (ATI, AIMS, etc.), community resources, college prep (HS).
- Send a draft to Director for approval
- Send final draft for translation

One Week Before the Event:

- Print out/make copies of the following items:
 - Arrow signs (Angelica Goebel's template)
 - Meeting Surveys (English & Spanish)
 - MASS & TUSD Flyers/Brochures (English & Spanish)
 - Sign in Sheets for parents and people attending
- Verify with Luis Orantes/Translators whether they will be bringing the Talk & Listen Kits or if the kits need to be picked up the day of the event
- Send reminder emails to all pertinent parties confirming attendance
- Test your electronic equipment the week before. Plug everything into wall; speakers, test internet access.
- Submit log of parent contact/phone calls to Marisela & Director
- Finalize list of students who will be recognized from all schools invited to the meeting. Print Certificates.

One Day Before the Event:

- Set up and test all technology (computer, internet, projector, microphones, speakers, lighting, ALE video, etc.) with a run through to identify any problems and solve them
- Make copies of the final draft of the Agenda (English & Spanish)

Day of the Event:

- Make sure restrooms are unlocked, clean, and well stocked. Remind families the location of the nearest restrooms at start of the meeting.
- Hang all arrow signs guiding families to the event from all parking lots
- Make sure all people present sign in (students and all family members). Turn in a copy of sign in sheets to Director the day after the event
- If Principals or TUSD Central office officials attend meeting, please recognize their presence.
- Collect parent feedback forms (surveys) and send them in to Marisela or Director the day after the event.
- Collect at least one of each type of flyer from each community resource table (and the MASS table) to submit to director the day after the event
- Take pictures and turn them in to Director and Marisela Dominguez the next day after event.
- Pick up your signs from parking lot and buildings and save them for the next parent quarterly session.
