UNCF Scholarships and Grants

Founded in 1944, UNCF (the United Negro College Fund) is the nation's largest and most effective minority education organization. UNCF now administers a wide range of over 400 programs.

UNCF awards scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students attending a UNCF member college or university as well as to those students attending other historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) and majority institutions. UNCF also supports faculty members through programs offering grants for research and dissertation completion. Information on these scholarships and faculty fellowship grants are provided for review on our website at www.uncf.org. There are over 400 scholarships listed on the UNCF website that are available to minorities. In addition, you may review a list of the 37 UNCF member institutions on our website.

Generally, once a student receives a UNCF scholarship, it may be renewed in subsequent years if students continue to meet the eligibility requirements of the scholarship and if funds are available. However, the renewal of a UNCF scholarship is not an automatic process. Students typically do not receive more than one UNCF scholarship during an academic year.

UNCF general scholarship eligibility criteria are as follows:

- Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale;
- Students must have an unmet financial need as verified by the Financial Aid Director;
- Students must complete a Financial Aid Form (FAF) or a Family Financial Aid Statement (FFS) and request that the Students Analysis Report (SAR) be sent to the financial aid office at their college or university.

All scholarships require that these basic criteria are met; however, many scholarships have additional criteria which you may review on our website.

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

All UNCF scholarships are listed on our website (www.uncf.org). Some scholarships are reserved for students attending one of the 37 UNCF Member Colleges and Universities. The 37 member schools are also listed on the website. If you do not plan to attend one of these member schools, search the scholarship database for those scholarships that are listed as: (ELIGIBLE SCHOOLS: Open) rather than (ELIGIBLE SCHOOLS: UNCF Institutes).

Be sure to read the FOR STUDENTS: SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION tab on the website.




The basic general requirements for receiving a UNCF scholarship are listed below:


- Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale;
- Students must have an unmet financial need as verified by the Financial Aid Director
- Students must complete a Financial Aid Form (FAF) or a Family Financial Aid Statement (FFS) and request that the Students Analysis Report (SAR) be sent to the financial aid office at their college or university.

All scholarships require that these basic criteria are met; however, many scholarships have additional criteria.

Please visit our UNCF website and search for scholarships that are currently being awarded. At any one time only a certain number of the total UNCF scholarships will be available for award. These will always appear in the <u>"FOR STUDENTS:/SCHOLARSHIP"</u> section of the website.



All scholarships may be viewed in the <u>"SEARCH ALL SCHOLARSHIPS"</u> section of the website throughout the year; however, as noted above, ONLY those scholarships selected for award during specific months will appear in the <u>"FOR STUDENTS:/SCHOLARSHIP"</u> section.



RECOMMENDATION: Applicants should visit the website periodically throughout the year to search for other scholarships as they come into the window for award and appear in the <u>"FOR STUDENTS:/SCHOLARSHIP"</u> section of the website.
