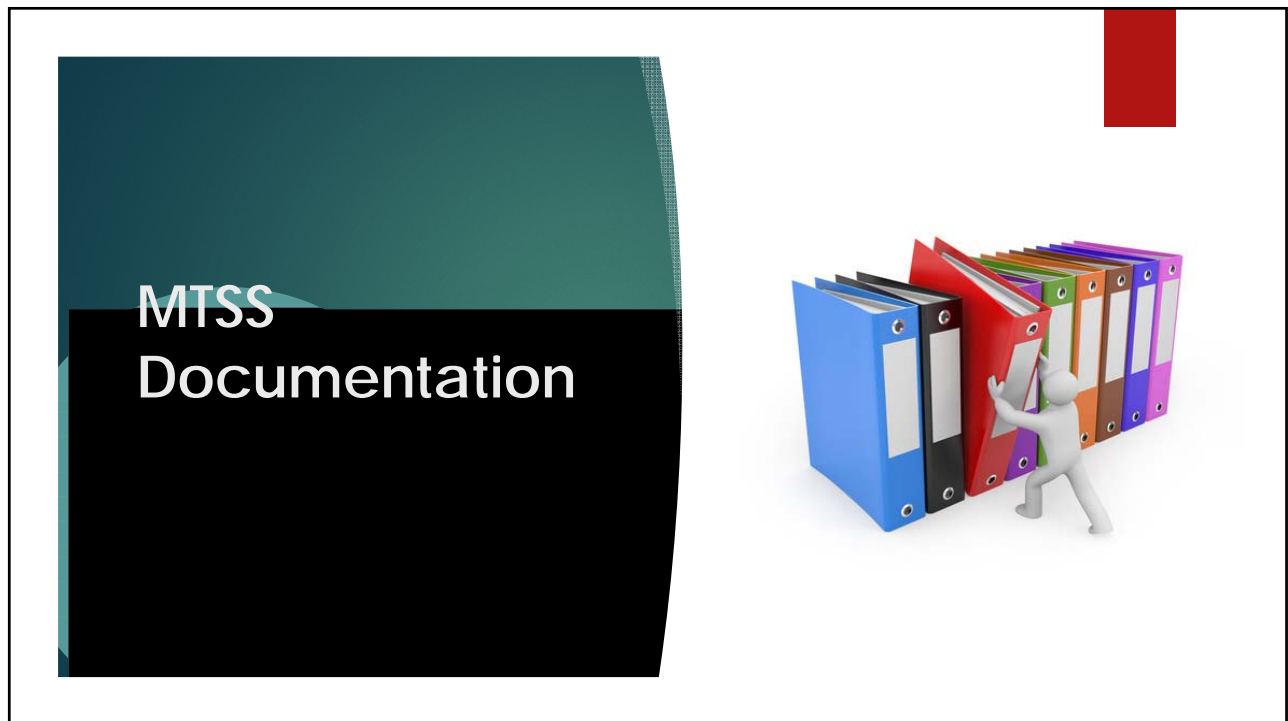

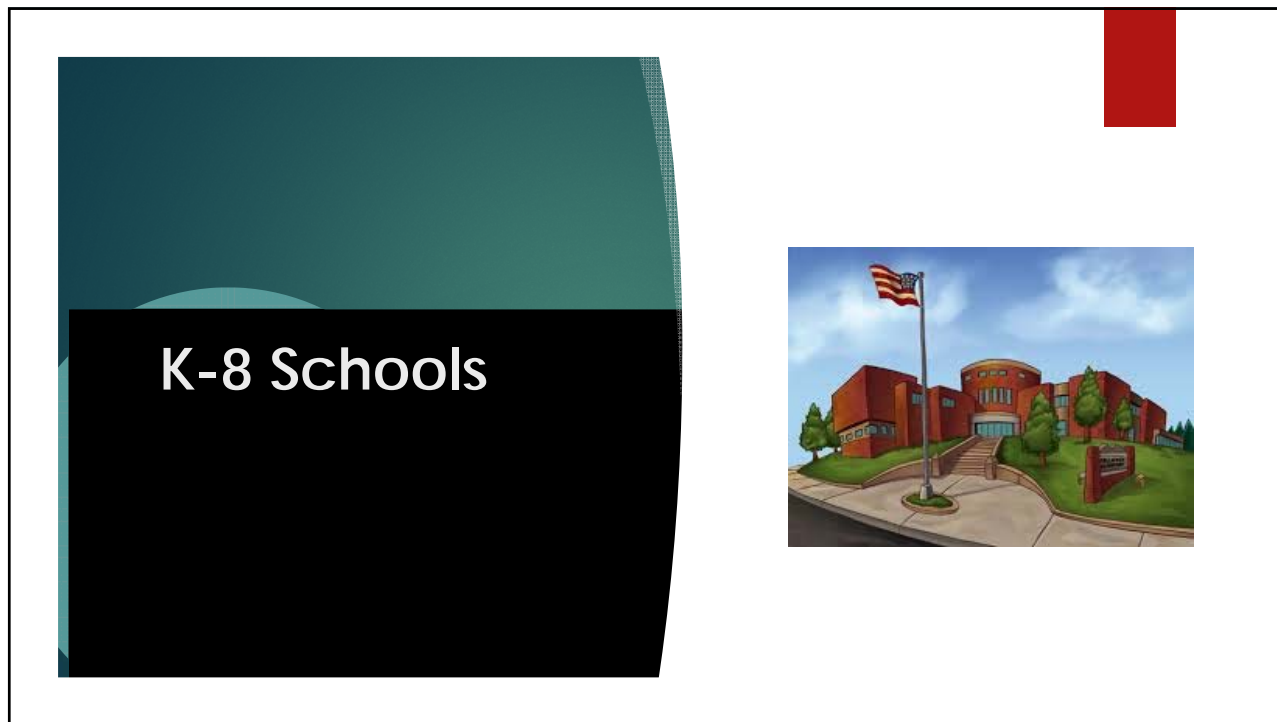

- ▶ **Utterback** – Highest percentage of discipline among Middle Schools – 11.61%
