



OPEN ENROLLMENT

- The goal of Open Enrollment is to provide school choice to district families.
- Open enrollment is for students who are not attending their neighborhood school of residency.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

- Transportation is provided for magnet schools, select academic programs and neighborhood students as follows:
 - Students attending elementary school who live 1 1/2 miles or more from school.
 - Middle School students who live at least 2 1/2 miles from school.
 - High school students who live at least 2 1/2 miles from school with no public bus service.
 - In accordance with A.R.S. §15-764, handicapped children (as defined by A.R.S. §15-761) in connection with any program, class or service.
- Open-enrolled students attending a school other than their designated neighborhood school must provide their own transportation (Exception: Please review the resource Topic 1 TUSD School Choice Calculator at the completion of this training video.

SCHOOL PERSONNEL RESPONSIBILITIES



- * Parent/guardian must receive a copy of the date-stamped application
- * Applications must be sent to the Office of School Community Services within 24 hours

THE LOTTERY

- Seats are offered based upon space availability.
- If there are more applicants than seats available, a lottery is held.
- Lotteries are run until all seats are filled.



OPEN ENROLLMENT/ MAGNET PLACEMENT

- School Community Services sends a letter to each student who has been selected.
- Parents must sign their Acceptance Letter and return it within 10 days.
- A student's placement status <u>has</u> to be verified for student registration and enrollment at the school.
