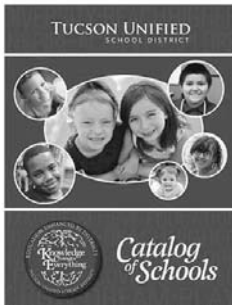

Family Guide for Remote Learning

Overview: This guide offers practical strategies to support your child during online instruction.



Build Routines and Expectations

Maintain regular sleep routines and wake times.

Create a visual learning schedule with your child (s).

Include built-in breaks for snacks, outdoor movement/exercise, rest, and play.

Post the schedule in an easy-to-see place to help guide your child.

Use a timer or other tool such as a smartphone, so your child knows when to switch activities.

Make Space for Learning

Establish a quiet dedicated learning space with your child that has a strong internet signal, if possible.

Have all learning materials and supplies at the table.

Use a shared space (e.g., living room or kitchen) to be able to monitor and interact with your child if needed.

Block age-inappropriate and distracting websites.

Stay in Touch with Teachers

Teachers will communicate regularly through the online platforms and virtual learning environments.

Encourage your student to remain in contact with their teacher.

Ask questions about your child's learning expectations, grades, and technical supports.

Share concerns and learning successes with teachers as well.

Help your Child "Own" Their Learning

Help your child set goals for learning and growing every day.

Encourage your child to review the calendars and virtual learning platforms for updates and assignment due dates.

Make sure your child knows how to find the help they need to be successful.

Provide support, encouragement, and expect your child to do their part.

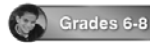

Arizona Civics Test

Attention juniors and parents of juniors: In 2015, the Arizona legislature passed the American Civics Act (House Bill 2064) requiring the graduating class of 2017 to pass a civics test based on the United States Immigration and Naturalization civics questions. Students will be required to score 60% or higher in order to graduate from high school or obtain a high school equivalency certificate. Students may retake the test as many times as necessary to pass. Students receiving special education services are exempt from obtaining a passing score unless required by an IEP.

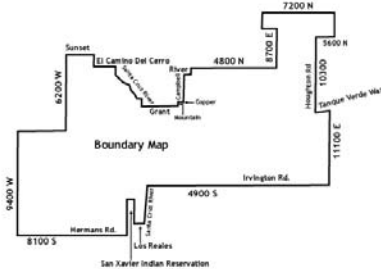

TUSD Transportation Workers Assist Fine Arts With Pandemic Safety Measures

Tucson Unified School District's transportation drivers are lending their talented skills to protect music students and staff during the pandemic. With the limited number of students physically attending school, bus drivers are available to assist other departments. TUSD Transportation Department has placed four of their employees on loan to TUSD's Fine and Performing Arts Department. Bus drivers Linda "Kansas" Kahle, Shena McDuffie, Kathy Ringo, and bus monitor Grace Burleigh, are all skilled seamstresses who have already created over 6,700 colorful cloth face masks for district employees and students. Currently, they are lending their sartorial skills to making cloth bell covers for wind instruments.

Music educators across the nation are concerned with the germ-laden aerosols wind instruments produce. Bell covers act like face masks for brass and woodwind instruments, preventing the aerosols from spreading.

For the past week, the four transportation workers have been bringing their sewing machines into the Fine Arts workshop and setting up a production line to produce 1100 bell covers of various sizes. From small ones for clarinets, to larger ones for trumpets and trombones, with the largest for tubas.

It is pleasure to have the work room, once again, bustling with energy. The collaborative spirit of Transportation lending a hand to Fine Arts is evidence of how TUSD teamwork is meeting the challenge of keeping our students and staff safe.
