RFI #1673: Please provide confirmation that the events included in Table 7.1 (Annual Report at VII-337; titled “School Site Curricular Focus Distribution SY2016-17”) reflect the tallying of the events listed in Appendix VII-1. If there are events in Table 7.1 not reflected in Appendix VII-1, or if not all Appendix VII-1 events are reflected in Table 7.1, please list the titles of such events and the schools at which they occurred.

Response: Not all of the events represented in Table 7.1 are reflected in Appendix VII-1 because that appendix includes information from only a sample of school sites; it does not include information from all school sites. Although all sites report on school site curricular focus trainings, it is not practical to provide a full list of events for each school because the District provided over 800 different curricular focus training and events at school sites. However, Attachment RFI 1673 Curricular Focus Activities provides a checklist of the type of curricular focus events/trainings offered by each school for the 2016-17 school year.

RFI #1674: Identify the school sites that had not “completed/submitted” family engagement tracking reports, “submitted inaccurate reports,” those that “did not reflect curriculum training,” and those “at risk of [USP] noncompliance” as described in Appendix VII-9 in connection with each Family and Community Outreach department data review meeting identified in Appendix VII-9. Please provide the data broken down by the type of issue raised by the school’s family engagement report(s) (as listed above), and by data review meeting date at which the issue was identified.

Response: The requested information is provided at Attachment RFI 1674 Data Review Notes by School. The purpose of the Family and Community Outreach (“FCO”) department’s data reviews of site reports in each semester (November and March) was to ensure that all sites were on track to implement required activities (*i.e.*, at least one curricular focused training per semester) and to meet reporting requirements. The FCO department contacted the schools which had not submitted reports, had missing or incorrectly entered data, or did not include their curricular focus events. In every follow-up case, the issue resulted from a reporting error rather than a site practice. By the end of May, all schools had submitted required monitoring reports indicating they had met family engagement requirements, including at least one curricular-focused event per semester. As Table 7.1 shows (2016-17 Annual Report at VII-337), all school sites provided at least two curricular focus trainings, and 70 schools offered at least 6 or more.

RFI #1675: Which six schools were identified to “receive targeted family engagement support in SY2017-18” as is indicated in Appendix VII-9 for the June 12, 2017 meeting, and why? Please also detail what the “targeted family engagement support” entails.

Response: The six schools identified in Appendix VII-9 are Davison, Oyama, Secrist, Utterback, Catalina, and Santa Rita. The objective of targeted support is to increase the quality of family engagement offerings and the number of parents attending parent-teacher conferences and other family events during the 2017-18 school year. Each of the three FCO program coordinators works with two of the sites as mentors/advisors to the site administrators and family engagement contacts. Coordinators meet with sites at least once per month to discuss concerns and review the sites’ plans and implementation of family engagement efforts. In addition, each school site, in partnership with the FCO department, surveys parents/guardians, staff, and students and conducts focus groups in order to identify the specific family engagement issues at their school.

RFI #1676: Please provide confirmation that the District tracked the race/ethnicity of visitors to the Family Resource Centers (“FRCs”) for the 2016-17 school year (*see* AR at VII-351; *but see* Appendix VII-20 (tallied visits to FRCs not broken down by race/ethnicity)). If the District did indeed track the race/ethnicity of FRC visitors, please provide the data presented in Appendix VII-20 broken down by race/ethnicity.

Response: As explained in the 2016-17 Annual Report, the District made efforts to track family engagement data, including FRC visitor information, by race/ethnicity. (AR 16-17 at VII-351.) Although the District was not able to track the race/ethnicity of visitors to the Family Resource Centers in SY 2016-17, it anticipates that the Dynamics platform will enable communication between the data collected at FRCs and Synergy, which will facilitate the creation of data reports tracked by race.

RFI #1677: Did the District track the number of (a) magnet and/or open enrollment applications submitted at FRCs and...

Response: Please see response to RFI #1678.

RFI #1678: (b) visits related to such application for the 2016-17 school year? If so, please provide that data (and, to the extent possible, break that data down by race/ethnicity). (Mendoza Plaintiffs understand that Appendix VII-25 may reflect all magnet/open enrollment-related Family Resource Center visits.)

Response: The District tracked applications and visits related to OE/Magnet applications. This data is reported in Appendix VII-25. Family race/ethnicity data was not collected.

RFI #1679: Does Appendix VII-23 reflect all the magnet and/or open enrollment related classes/workshops held at FRCs in 2016-17?

Response: Yes.

RFI #1680: How many individual parents attended each magnet and/or open enrollment related class/workshop? (Please breakdown the data by race/ethnicity, to the extent that data is available.)

Response: Six participants attended the GATE informational sessions, twelve attended the Dual Language sessions, and no participants attended the February and March workshops held at each FRC. The largest participation occurred in conjunction with events such as the Jacket Party (700 participants) and Health and Enrollment Fair (50 participants). Family race/ethnicity data was not collected at these events.

RFI #1681: Will the configuration of the District's new Dynamics software (described in the AR at VII-350-351) be developed to include tracking race/ethnicity of families served at Family Resource Centers?

Response: Yes. The Dynamics software will allow the race/ethnicity of families served at the Family Resource Centers to be tracked.

RFI #1682: The TUSD AR describes FRC-related “participant surveys for selected workshops.” (AR at VII-351.) Please list each “selected” FRC workshop for which participant surveys were conducted. (While Appendix VII-33 provides the title to some of these workshops, it is clear from the survey results that Appendix VII-33 does not comprehensively list such workshops.)

Response: The participant surveys were conducted at eight FRC workshops. These workshops included “Life Skills”, “Home 101”, “Diabetes”, “Tomando Control de tu Salud”, “English as a Second Language”, “Kith and Kin”, “US Immigration and The USA Constitution Class-Por Un Arizona Unido” and “Es Dificil ser Mujer”

Mendoza Plaintiffs seek this information pursuant to USP Section X,E, 3 in order to assess whether the District is complying in good faith with its desegregation obligations and the terms of the USP and relevant Court orders.
