SPECIAL MASTER'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION RELATED TO THE TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATION OBSERVATION TOOL

Introduction

On July 16, 2020, this Court issued an Order (ECF 2497) that, among other things, calls for the Special Master to file ".... the 2020 – 21 Technology Integration Observation Tool (TIOT)¹ with a summary of explanations for any objections remaining for any party to the evaluation tool he approves." After consultation with the Special Master, the District submitted a revised version of the TIOT on June 16, 2020 (ECF 2477-4). While this revision was submitted prior to the Court order, it addresses the concerns of the Special Master and the Mendoza plaintiffs to ensure that the tool encompassed the academic content of the curriculum. In addition, the Special Master had recommended that the TIOT include the development of students' capacity to engage in complex authentic problem-solving². The revision adequately does that. Therefore, there seems no outstanding objections to the revised TIOT.

Recommendation

The District has addressed the issues raised by the Mendoza plaintiffs and the Special Master related to the TIOT. The Special Master approves the version of the TIOT filed with the Court (ECF 2477-4). The TIOT was used for the first time in the fall term of 2020. The Special Master's approval of the form should not preclude the District from making clarifying revisions or additions predicated on changes in the curriculum.

¹ The TIOT is used to evaluate teachers' use of technology and to identify the needs for additional professional learning for teachers related to technology.

² For example, simulations can provide students with experiences in applying what they are learning in mathematics to real-time challenges.
