RECRUITING INSTRUCTIONS

PROCESS FOR TRAVEL:

- Forms /Approval
- Transportation
- Lodging
- Recruitment Kit(items)

1. RELEASED TIME FORM:

For each trip you must provide the RELEASE TIME FORM # FIN 1000 and the RELEASED TIME BREAKDOWN of expenses # FIN 1001 (all hotel, per diem and airfare rates must be completed on this form before signatures). Fill out the RELEASED TIME FORM on the intranet under "FORMS". Proceed to "VIEW BY DEPT" and use the drop down to "FINANCIAL SERVICES" and click on "VIEW".

Lodging: Contact the designated accommodations on the event brochure to inquire about rates and print the price quote (district rates may also be used).

Transportation: Go online to any car rental provider and get a quote for travel dates and print forms.

Airfare: Must be processed through our contracted vendor (Rio Grande at 520-722-7300). All forms from the event brochure, hotel rates, and rental car will need to be printed off and attached to the **RELEASED TIME FORM**.

Two categories for travel:

- HBCU (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) and HACU (Hispanic Colleges and Universities or highly diverse populated schools) these sites are paid from the DESEG

budget (# 00151125705068/6583) and the required signatures are the **traveler, Anna Maiden, Sam Brown, Finance, and Superintendent.**

- All other Colleges and Universities these sites are paid from the Title II budget (# 14310025705042/6583). The required signatures are the **traveler, Anna Maiden, Richard Foster, Finance and Superintendent.**
- Once the paperwork has been approved by the Superintendent's office you may contact the travel agent to book your ticket. The approved package must be submitted to Ramona Beltran (Executive Assistant) to create a requisition. No further arrangements for travel may be made until you have purchase order (PO) number. Once you receive a PO number from Ramona Beltran you may register for the conference, reserve your rental car, and book your hotel.

2. TRAVEL: During your travel be sure to save all receipts for gas, lodging, checked baggage, (receipts not required for food). You will be required upon your return to file a **TRAVEL EXPENSE CLAIM FORM # FIN 1003** and submit to Cindy Hewitt (Accounts Payable Manager) in Finance for reimbursement.

3. EVENT: You will want to arrive at the job fair at the appropriate time designated on the event brochure or at least one hour before the event to set up. Set up table with recruitment items. Discuss with each individual that approaches the booth about the district, Tucson area, and community. TUSD accepts resumes for all categories of teaching. However, we only interview the critical needs areas of (math, science and special education). For all other areas explain to interested applicants how to apply and answer any questions they may have about the district.

4. EXPLANATION OF FORMS:

- ❖ **Sign in sheet-** have all individuals that come to the table sign in;
- ❖ **TUSD stipend sheet-** all critical needs areas of (math, science, and special education) will receive a one time stipend and moving allowance(see stipend list for amounts);
- ❖ **Interview questions-** interviews will be conducted on site with principals or administrators for individuals in critical needs areas only ;
- ❖ **Blank letters of intent-** are for those individuals who interviewed in the critical needs who you feel are strong candidates to teach for the district. If a letter of intent is issued, use the carbon paper to make a duplicate. Explain that the letter of intent is contingent upon successful reference check, issuance of appropriate certification, and AZ IVP fingerprint card. The candidate receives the original and the duplicate is the district copy.

- ❖ **Certification:** ADE certification section is a reference for any questions about reciprocal certificates or fingerprint reciprocity. Information also listed in district flyer.

- ❖ Upon your return you will be required to file a **TRAVEL EXPENSE CLAIM FORM # FIN 1003** and attach all receipts for travel(lodging, car rental, checked baggage, fuel) and submit to Cindy Hewitt (Accounts Payable Manager) in Finance within 7 days of returning.
- ❖ Submit all Letters of Intent to **Tracey McGhee** (Sr. HR Coordinator) or **Sara Gamez** (Sr. HR Analyst) for processing.
