## Are you a FRESHMAN interested in College?

Why go to college?

- More Money – Average 4-year bachelor's degree holder earns nearly \$1 million more in their lifetime than a high school diploma holder
- Stable Jobs - College degree = 3.2% unemployed  
- High school degree only = 6.5% unemployed

- Federal Aid
  - \$24 billion of FREE money offered for need-based grants in 2014
  - \$100 billion of low-interest government loans in 2014

### START NOW to ENSURE FUTURE ADMISSION

- GPA – aim for at least 3.0 *unweighted*
- Complete the Sweet 16 (classes needed for college enrollment)
  - 4 years of English Composition or Literature
  - 4 years of Math - Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-calculus
  - 3 years of Laboratory Science - Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science, integrated lab science etc.
  - 2 years of Social Science
    - American History (required)
    - World history, Economics, sociology, government, etc.
  - 2 years of a 2<sup>nd</sup> Language – must be same language both years
  - 1 year of Fine Arts
- Plan to take the SAT or ACT exam (Junior year)
- Community Leadership/Involvement – Sports, clubs, church, volunteering etc.
- Forge strong relationships – Teachers, Counselors, Community Leaders

## WHAT CLASSES DO I NEED TO TAKE? (Ninth through 12th Grades)

The Arizona state university system requires the following college preparatory pattern of classes for admission. Some area high schools, such as Salpointe Catholic and Empire, have additional requirements.

## Transferring from Pima

If you're planning to transfer to a four-year college or university, the work you complete at Pima Community College will put you well on your way to earning your bachelor's degree. Here's how:

**PCC's transfer partnerships:** The credits you earn at Pima are accepted by your target college or university.

**Arizona General Education Curriculum Certificate:** Earn a certificate with either an Arts, Business or Sciences concentration by completing courses that meet lower division general education requirements for UA, NAU, ASU and other institutions, as well as the general education requirements for Pima's transfer degrees.

The AGEC-A (Arts), AGEC-B (Business) and AGEC-S (Sciences) have the same categories - English Composition, Humanities and Fine Arts, Biological and Physical Sciences, Mathematics, and Social and Behavioral Sciences, as well as courses that meet special requirements for Intensive Writing and Critical Inquiry, Cultural Diversity and Global Awareness - with specific required courses to fulfill those categories.

**Degrees for transfer:** For students pursuing an AGEC, the College strongly recommends they also complete the Associate of Arts, Associate of Fine Arts, Associate of Business Administration or Associate of Science degrees before transferring.
