- GPA aim for at least 3.0 unweighted
- Complete the Sweet 16 (classes needed for college enrollment)
  - o 4 years of English Composition or Literature
  - o 4 years of Math Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-calculus
  - 3 years of Laboratory Science Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science, integrated lab science etc.
  - 2 years of Social Science
    - American History (required)
    - World history, Economics, sociology, government, etc.
  - o 2 years of a 2<sup>nd</sup> Language must be same language both years
  - o I year of Fine Arts
- Plan to take the SAT or ACT exam (Junior year)
- Community Leadership/Involvement Sports, clubs, church, volunteering etc.

#### **Business Focus**

The hospitality management program is designed to be accredited by Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP), a business-based, teaching-focused accreditation. This focus allows students the opportunity to gain a foundation in business, giving them diverse skills that may translate across other industries. Many other universities have hospitality accreditations that are less focused on business courses.




