	Agenda must include the following: Department programs/services, ALE Video, Magnet Programs, TUSD Stats,
	Data (ATI, AIMS, etc.), community resources, college prep (HS).
	Send a draft to Director for approval
	Send final draft for translation
One V	Veek Before the Event:
	Print out/make copies of the following items:
	Arrow signs (Angelica Goebel's template)
	Meeting Surveys (English & Spanish)
	 MASS & TUSD Flyers/Brochures (English & Spanish)
	 Sign in Sheets for parents and people attending
	Verify with Luis Orantes/Translators whether they will be bringing the Talk & Listen Kits or if the kits need to be
	picked up the day of the event
	Send reminder emails to all pertinent parties confirming attendance
	Test your electronic equipment the week before. Plug everything into wall; speakers, test internet access.

	Set up and test all technology (computer, internet, projector, microphones, speakers, lighting, ALE video, etc.)

	Make sure restrooms are unlocked, clean, and well stocked. Remind families the location of the nearest
