

As requires by the September 6th court order granting Tucson Unified School District partial unitary status, a three-year integration plan is a court mandate.

DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION:

In order to diligently comply with the court order to fulfill the purpose of the three-year integration plan, the district will be developing a number of integration strategies for each school. A district committee consisting of both school-level and district-level personnel, as well as parents, will be convened. Additionally, in order to determine what factors presently contribute to continued racial concentration at some schools, and integration at other schools, the administration is recommending a review of existing boundaries for all district schools. The purpose of the review will be to determine the extent to which existing boundaries at any of the district schools are potentially contributing to continued racial concentration. All work and recommendations from previous boundary reviews in years past will be studied as a reference point. In addition to boundaries, the district is proposing an extensive review of all existing transportation routes and hubs for the purpose of determining modifications to current transportation routes that could increase integration and decrease racial concentration. PURPOSE:

Update the Governing Board on three proposals being considered to improve Tucson Unified schools.

DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION:

Three proposals are being considered to improve Tucson Unified schools: removal of the K-5 boundary at Roskruge K-8 School, withdrawal of the magnet program at Roskruge and the addition of third grade to Johnson Primary School. These are outlined in Exhibits 1-3. Although each could be considered separately, the first two overlap simply because they involve the same school and school community.

To resolve these proposals, staff advisory teams developed options and set up processes for community engagement. Then, committees of stakeholders were formed. Those committees began meeting in the last couple weeks to address proposals and make recommendations. At the same time staff has been meeting with the PTO/PTA and community of Roskruge on the magnet status. The committees and the schedule of meetings are shown in Exhibits 4-6. The committees are scheduled to complete their work in March with recommendations to the superintendent. This is to be followed with a report to the Board on April 9.

ROSKRUGE K-5 BOUNDARY CHANGE

Roskruge is a K-8 School with a K-5 attendance area and has never had an attendance area for the middle school grades. Originally, there was one K-5 attendance area, immediately surrounding the school. In 2010, with the closure of Richey, the District added the Richey attendance area to Roskruge (the "Annex" area). Currently, 22 K-5 students from the Roskruge neighborhood area attend Roskruge (68% Hispanic, 27% Anglo, 5% Other); 42 students from the Annex area attend Roskruge (79% Hispanic; 14% Native American; 7% Other).

The primary purpose of this proposal is to strengthen the Two Way Dual Language (TWDL) program from Kindergarten to 8th grade by making it "application only" to enroll students interested and committed to the TWDL program. These students will have a better chance to become bilingual and bi-literate at an early age, reach high academic standards, and develop cross-cultural competencies.

As required by Policy JC, the District is initiating a Boundary Review Process for the proposed boundary change. The District has convened a boundary committee made up of a site team from each potentially-impacted school (administrator, parent, teacher – at minimum) and a representative from each plaintiff class and from the Special Master (See Exhibit 4). The Boundary Committee will meet February through April to evaluate options to relocate the existing Roskruge K-5 boundary, to propose and evaluate various scenarios in an effort to increase integration, and to facilitate a smooth transition for students, parents, and stakeholders. The meeting schedule is attached as Exhibit 6.

EXHIBIT 2

ROSKRUGE WITHDRAWAL OF MAGNET STATUS

In a parallel, but separate process, the District is considering removal of the magnet status of Roskruge. By withdrawing magnet status, the District would not be reducing its commitment to academic achievement or integration. The District commits to sustaining the TWDL program, retaining resources and funds provided to other TWDL schools (and more, as Roskruge will receive additional magnet transition funding for a limited time), providing transportation to support the TWDL program, retaining funds for support staff and teaching staff, assessing the viability of express bus service, and retaining its magnet coordinator through the following school year.

The proposed withdrawal is based on the following: TUSD operates 11 magnet schools serving students in grades K-8. Seven of the eleven schools sit within a two-mile radius from the **District's** central offices in downtown Tucson (Borton ES, Carrillo ES, Davis ES, Drachman K-8, Holladay ES, Mansfeld MS, and Roskruge). The District has successfully moved five of these seven schools from Racially Concentrated in SY2013-14 to Integrated in SY2018-19 (Borton was already Integrated; Roskruge was not then and is not now). During this time, all seven schools have been recruiting from the same pool of non-Latino students in the downtown area (and beyond) to integrate their schools. However, only Roskruge has had another school, Davis ES, offering the same magnet theme only one mile away.

As noted by the Special Master in January 2019, the language requirements of the TWDL model "complicate[] efforts to integrate the school." Each year significant numbers of mostly-Latino students from TWDL elementary schools apply to Roskruge for 6th grade, hoping to continue on the pathway towards earning the Seal of Bi-literacy. Their enrollment works against integrating the school. Although Roskruge has continued its efforts to increase integration, moving from 85% Hispanic in 2012-13 to 77% in 2017-18, it has been unable to approach the 70% threshold, and its Hispanic population grew to 79% in 2018-19.

EXHIBIT 3

UPDATE ON THE PROPOSAL TO CONSIDER THE ADDITION OF THIRD GRADE TO JOHNSON PRIMARY SCHOOL

This proposal originated from an interest in the Johnson Primary School community to have a third grade at Johnson. The change would increase enrollment in Johnson and should have positive impacts on academic performance because students would not transition from Johnson to Lawrence in 3rd grade, the year they take the AzMERIT state assessments. It would also allow Johnson to have an AzMERIT grade. The change would have no impact on the racial/ethnic composition of the primary grades at Johnson or Lawrence and Johnson has sufficient capacity to serve the additional students.

Tucson Unified has convened a steering committee made up of a site teams from Lawrence and Johnson, a representative from the Pascua Yaqui Tribe, and a representative from each plaintiff class and from the Special Master (See Exhibit 5). The committee will meet February through April to evaluate options, including an understanding of parent preferences, to create an optimum solution for students, parents, and stakeholders. The meeting schedule is attached as Exhibit 6.
