Sam,

Can the District please confirm that the proposed purchase would not be funded with 910(g) funds? Assuming the proposal does not involve 910(g) funding, Mendoza Plaintiffs have no objection to the proposal, but they do share the Special Master's concern regarding "the District seeking Board approval--even contingent--before prior review by the P/SM." In that regard, Mendoza Plaintiffs see that the Board approved the purchase agreement on April 4, 2017 "with authorization for the Director of Planning to Execute the Agreement." While Mendoza Plaintiffs appreciate that the District intends to seek "final approval" for the purchase, they believe that District's actions signal to the community its intent to proceed and is inconsistent with the purpose of the DIA process. (See Court's June 12, 2015 Order (Doc. 1809) at 4-5.) They therefore ask that, moving forward, the District take care to characterize its pre-DIA presentations to the Board of proposals subject to the DIA process as "Study Items."
