1. How old must my child be to attend school?
Students must be 5 years of age before September 1 of the current school year to attend kindergarten and 6 years of age before September 1 to enter first grade. For more information, see [Policy JEB](#) and [Regulation JEB-R](#).

2. What school will my child attend?
Unless you have made special arrangements through [Open Enrollment](#), your child will attend your attendance area school. To find your attendance area school, use Pima Association of Government's [School-Address Lookup](#) or call School Community Services, 225-6400.

3. Does my child have to attend the attendance area school?
No. Through [Open Enrollment](#), you can apply to have your child attend any school in TUSD.

4. How can I get my child into special programs like Magnet Schools or GATE?
Complete a [School Choice/Open Enrollment Application](#) to have your child attend a Magnet School. To participate in the [Gifted and Talented Education \(GATE\)](#) program, students are evaluated by the district. Fill out a [Permission to Evaluate](#)

[Community Partnership Council](#), and by joining the Parent-Teacher-Student association.

7. When are the first and last days of schools, holidays, and half-days for this school year?

8. What will the school be serving for breakfast and lunch?
See the [School Menus](#) for the monthly school meal menu.

9. What should my child wear to school? Does my child have to wear a uniform?
[TUSD Governing Board policy JICA](#) sets the standards of dress for TUSD schools. Some schools require uniforms. <p>1. <i>Who should I call if I have questions regarding transportation?</i></p> <p>520-225-4800 – Transportation's Customer Service Department.</p> <p>2. <i>Who do I call after hours?</i></p> <p>Sometimes you may need to call after our offices have closed.</p> <p>If you are calling in regards to an emergency or if you need immediate information on your students bus location, please contact School Safety at (520) 584-7676. They will transfer you to the on-call dispatcher.</p> <p>For all other after-hours questions, please use the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ If you need to change your address or are requesting an alternate pick up or drop off, please contact your child's school. ◦ If you wish to speak to someone, please call during our regular business hours, or leave a voicemail message at our main line, 520-225-4800, and we will contact you within two (2) business days. ◦ You can always email transportation your questions or concerns at any time. They will let you know where you can get on the bus and/or if a stop will be re-instated.</p> <p>13. <i>What if my child no longer needs transportation?</i></p> <p>If your child is eligible for transportation but will not use it, please call the Transportation's Customer Service Department at 520-225-4800.</p> <p>14. <i>What does it mean if my child is must be met?</i></p> <p>The child will not be let off the bus without an authorized person present at the bus stop.</p> <p>15. <i>Do you do door-to-door pick up?</i></p> <p>No. We do not meet students at the door, nor do we accompany students to the door. Bus stops are at the curb.</p> <p>16. <i>Are there cameras on the bus?</i></p> <p>Yes, all of our buses have cameras.</p> <p>17. <i>My child lives within the walk radius and the walk path is unsafe. Do we get transportation?</i></p> <p>To report your walk path unsafe, please contact Transportation at 520-225-4800.</p> <p>If our School Safety determines the walk path unsafe, you will receive route information as soon as possible.</p> <p>18. <i>If my child is sick, will they be transported home during the school day?</i></p> <p>No. You must return your child home.</p>		

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3. *What are the bus rules?*

See the [bus conduct page](#) for the rules of behavior.

4. *If my child qualifies for transportation, when will I receive a copy of my child's bus stop info?*

If your child is enrolled by the due date, you will receive a letter, via US Mail, two weeks prior to the start of school with the information.

If your child is enrolled after the due date, you will be notified by phone or mail as your bus stop assignment information becomes available. It may be two to three weeks after the start of school.

5. *Can my child's pick up and drop off addresses differ?*

Yes. Please [contact your school](#) to follow the process for approval. Upon approval by the Transportation Department, you will be notified when, and if, the route can be set up.

The addresses have to be consistent 5 days a week. The alternate pick up or drop off address must be in your attendance area. You must be eligible for transportation based on your home address, not the alternate address.

6. *What is the Wee Care Program?*

Wee Care is a program for our TUSD kindergarten bus riders. Wee Care is focused on enhancing safety procedures for our newest bus riders. Parents/Guardians will need to determine whether their child will be met by themselves or another adult at the bus stop or if their child will walk with a "bus buddy."

19. *Who's responsible for getting my child from daycare to the bus or from the bus to daycare?*

The daycare staff stands in the place of the parent and must meet the child at the bus just as a parent would. Please take this into account when considering child care.

20. *Will my student ride the same bus in the afternoon as the morning?*

We attempt to route students on the same bus with the same bus driver, but this is not always possible.

21. *How long is a typical bus ride?*

Ride time depends on the distance between your home and school and the additional riders/stops on your bus route.

22. *What if my child receives a bus conduct report?*

All bus conduct reports are sent to the school administrator. According to district policy, the school administrator determines all disciplinary action.

23. *Are there monitors on the bus?*

Our monitors are added to buses on a case-by-case basis.

24. *Is there supervision at bus stops?*

No, but we supervise at transfer points.

25. *Is a bus stop ever dropped or eliminated?*

Yes, if a bus stop is not used for 10 consecutive days, the bus stop will be eliminated.

7. *How can I find out if I qualify for Incentive Transportation?*
- Tucson Unified provides an incentive to diversify the student population by offering transportation to some open enrollment students. See info on [Incentive Transportation](#).
8. *Do Open Enrollment students qualify for transportation?*
- Most open enrollment students do not qualify for transportation. However, [Incentive Transportation](#) is available for some students if they live within the boundaries of a racially concentrated school as defined by the [Unitary Status Plan](#).
9. *How do I find out if my child qualifies for transportation?*
- Generally, school bus transportation is provided for students attending their neighborhood schools. See [Transportation Eligibility](#) for additional details.
- Contact Transportation's Customer Service Department at 520-225-4800.
- [Contact the school](#) your student is attending.
10. *Does my child need to be attending a Tucson Unified school to take TUSD transportation?*
- Yes. A child must be enrolled in one of our schools to ride a school bus.
11. *If my child withdraws before the end of the year, will transportation be cancelled?*
- Yes. Transportation will be cancelled when a student withdraws from school.

12. *What if my child is eligible for transportation, hasn't used it and suddenly needs it?*
26. *Can my child be transported only for the morning or afternoon?*
- Yes, you can request only morning or afternoon by contacting our Customer Service at 520-225-4800.
27. *If my child lives outside of the Tucson Unified School District but attends a Tucson Unified school, does my child qualify for transportation?*
- No. We can not transport outside of the [district boundaries](#).
28. *Do Pre-K students qualify for transportation?*
- No, unless they have an Individual Education Plan (IEP). Please see [Exceptional Education](#) for assistance.
29. *What do I do, if my child leaves something on the bus?*
- Call our Customer Service at 520-225-4800.
30. *The bus didn't show up on time for my child. How long should they wait at the stop?*
- Your child should arrive at the stop at least 10 minutes before the scheduled arrival time of the bus.
- If the bus is late, ask your child to remain at the stop. Buses break down, roads are blocked, drivers become ill or have emergencies, but there will always be a bus at every stop.
- If the wait becomes **longer than 10 minutes**, call our Customer Service Department at 520-225-4800.

31. *What time should my student arrive at the morning (AM) bus stop?*
- Students should be at the stop at least **10 minutes prior** to scheduled pick-up time.

Arizona Civics Test

Attention juniors and parents of juniors: In 2015, the Arizona legislature passed the American Civics Act (House Bill 2064) requiring the graduating class of 2017 to pass a civics test based on the United States Immigration and Naturalization civics questions. Students will be required to score 60% or higher in order to graduate from high school or obtain a high school equivalency certificates. Students may retake the test as many times as necessary to pass. Students receiving special education services are exempt from obtaining a passing score unless required by an IEP.

Steps for Dual Enrollment Courses

1. The High School Principal identifies the teachers interested in teaching dual enrollment courses.
2. The High School Principal contacts the Director of Advanced Learning or CTE Coordinator, as appropriate.
3. The Director of Advanced Learning creates a Board Action Item to have new courses reviewed by the Governing Board and added to the Intergovernmental Agreement.
4. The teacher completes the online application to apply for certification.
5. The teacher submits official transcripts for certification review.
6. Once the course is approved, added to the Intergovernmental Agreement, and teacher certification is approved, the teacher may teach the course for Dual Credit.

Our Curriculum is infused with Multicultural Education

At Tucson Unified, we recognize the value of multicultural education in supporting student success. Multicultural education acknowledges that the ways in which students learn and think are deeply influenced by their cultural identity and heritage and that to teach culturally diverse students effectively requires educational approaches that value and recognize their cultural backgrounds. In this way, multicultural education aims to improve the learning and success of all students, particularly students from cultural groups that have been historically underrepresented.

In practice, educators modify or eliminate educational policies, programs, materials, lessons, and instructional practices that are either discriminatory toward or insufficiently inclusive of diverse cultural perspectives.

Why do we need a Multicultural Curriculum?

1. To prepare students for diverse workplaces and multicultural environments
2. To expose biases, stereotypes, and policies that can restrict achievement
3. To ensure that content is fair, accurate, and inclusive
4. To accommodate the diverse teaching and learning styles of teachers and students
5. To help students, faculty, and staff become advocates for multicultural awareness



The district's Multicultural Framework for Student Academic Success is articulated through the district policies and initiatives. Tucson Unified recognizes the growing diversity of cultures in the district and commits itself to ensure that all aspects of policies, curricula, practices, programs, and services promote intercultural understanding and addresses the needs of students who have been historically marginalized or underrepresented.

Tucson Unified's multicultural curriculum uses the [Anti-Bias Framework](#), developed by the [Southern Poverty Law Center](#), and culturally responsive teaching as a basis for effective anti-bias education at every grade level. The anti-bias anchor standards provide a set of age-appropriate learning outcomes divided into four domains: identity, diversity, justice and action.

The curriculum, which is inclusive of the histories, cultures, and contributions of diverse groups of people, enriches learning for all students, preparing them to work toward structural equality and equity by engaging them in critical thinking around issues of racism, sexism, classism, linguicism, ageism, genderism, and more.
