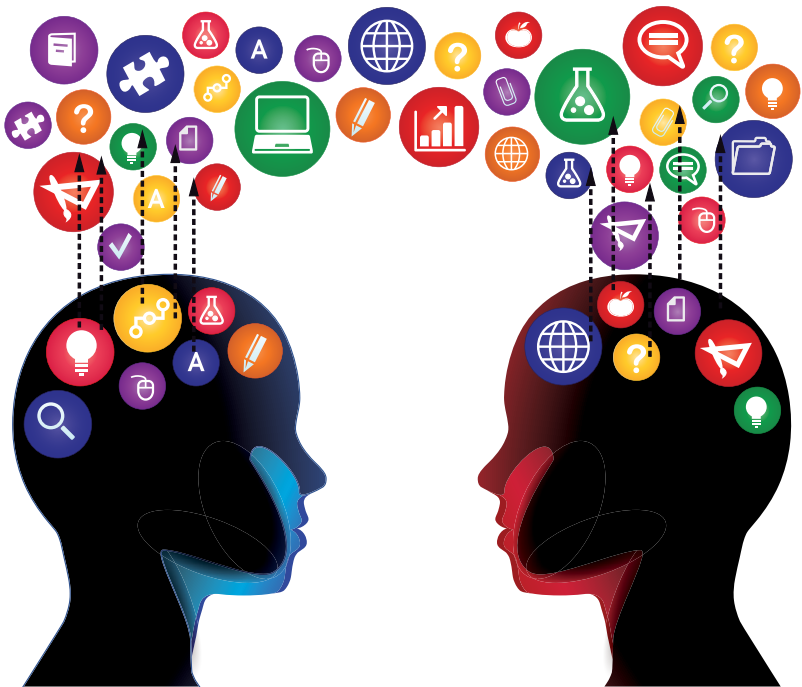

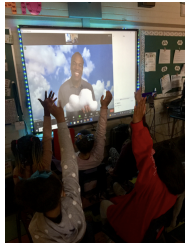

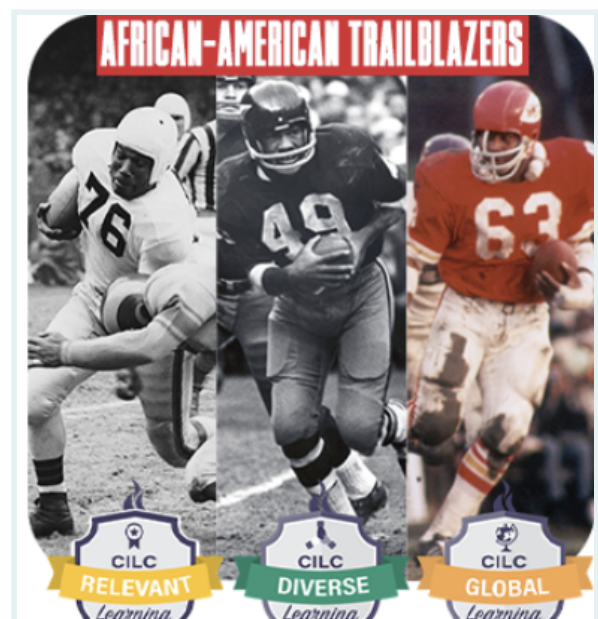

Join us to learn more about the African American Soldiers' journey for equal rights.

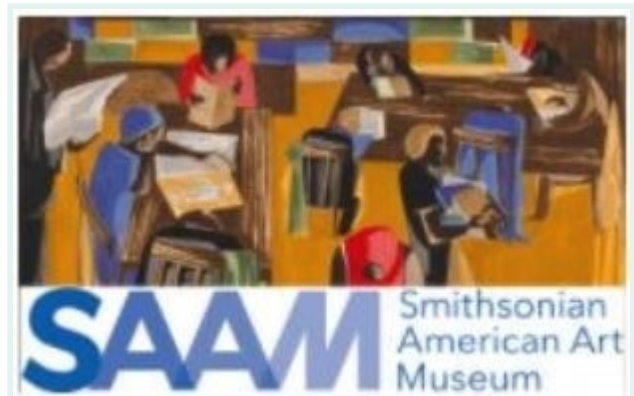

TALK SPACE - OVERVIEW

- The therapist will initiate the parental or legal guardian consent process
- In order to show consent, the parent or guardian will need to read, review, and agree (via video recording) to Talkspace's standard Consent to Therapy alongside teen when the form appears within the member's room. ID will also be required.
- Note: Most states do not allow therapists to share information about their teen client's progress with their parent/guardian without a signed release from the teen
