The Technology Condition Index (TCI) School Year 2021-2022 Narrative Report August 23, 2022

The school district's hardware inventory data between School Year 2020-2021 and School Year 2021-2022 shows the following key results:

- The overall TCI for the TUSD rating remains the same as the previous year, from 4.87 to 4.87
- The student's device index rating shows an increase from last year's 4.81 to the current year's 4.84.
- The Teacher Proficiency index slightly fell from 4.93 to 4.85, a reduction of 1.66 percent.
- The Wireless Index rating decreased from 5.00 to 4.91.

Notably, the Technology Condition Index report indicated a slightly decreased in the district's desktop and tablet inventory during SY 2021-2022. On the other hand, the district's laptops increased by 60.98 percent, which increased the contribution of one laptop per student (1:1) Ratio across all the schools in the district.

The Technology Services team also observed a slight decrease in student desktops and tablets as a part of the technology performant improvement process; several of the desktops, tablets, and other outdated hardware devices went for disposal. In addition, the school district purchased high-quality new machines to replace obsolete devices. Those new machines will be absorbed into standard school inventory over the 2022-2023 school year and counted as part of future indexes.
