#### If yes explain below:

The current trend in our behavior data shows a significant difference in the number of Hispanic students being disciplined compared to the other categories, and this is due to site's high Hispanic population on campus. We had a significant decrease in discipline incidents from December to January, going from 62 total incidents to 39.

In response to the behaviors that the discipline data represents we have held restorative conferences and classroom circles for students and teachers. The principals have been conducting classroom walk-throughs as well as formal observations and evaluations, and monitors are checking in with students in hallways and in classrooms when necessary. Assistant principals are frequently in the hallways interacting with students and motivating them to be in class. PBIS rewards for positive behaviors are also in full effect, including the student store for following behavior expectations, a tardy competition for the fewest number of tardies per grade level per quarter, student of the month ceremonies, monthly lunchtime assemblies to engage students and promote school expectations, and free dress passes for following the uniform policy and keeping our campus clean. We are also holding lunch detention for students that are frequently tardy for class, which has decreased our tardy numbers.
