Over the past year, we at Tucson Unified have faced significant challenges as we adapt to a changing fiscal landscape. The expiration of federal ESSER funds and a steady decline in student enrollment have led to current and future budget deficits that we must address together. From a Human Resources perspective, the reduction in funding has required us to prioritize our hiring needs. This shift has also allowed us to focus on filling available positions as lower-priority vacant positions have been closed. However, the evolving financial situation has made it more difficult to find resources to raise pay, improve benefits, and recruit for specialized positions that are hard to fill.

This year, we collaborated with other departments to implement a district-wide hiring freeze, aimed at freeing up short-term resources and providing additional time for departments to align their work with next year's budget realities. We anticipate that continued vigilance and collaboration will be necessary in the coming year.

Looking ahead, it is crucial to address the longer-term financial challenges that raise questions about the size of our future workforce and our ability to meet the needs of all our students. We are committed to operating efficiently and participating in future problem-solving efforts, despite the challenges we face in recruitment and retention. We are dedicated to TUSD's vision and mission to serve all students, and we look forward to working together to navigate these financial uncertainties.

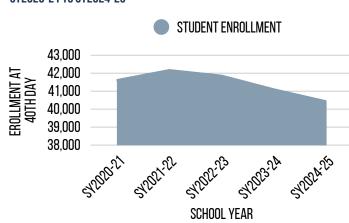

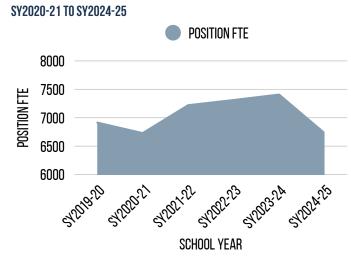


#### **TUSD STUDENT ENROLLMENT**

#### WHAT IS FTE?

FTE (Full-Time Equivalent) is a unit that measures an employee's work time in relation to a full-time schedule, where 1.0 FTE equals full-time work.

#### **ENROLLMENT AND GROWTH STRATEGIES**

TUSD reported 40,423 students at the 40th day of the 2024-2025 School Year. This represents a 1.6% decline from the prior year and a 2.9% decline from enrollment five years ago. The decline in public school enrollment is a phenomenon being experienced in states and districts across the nation, driven by both demographic trends and expanded school choice for private and homeschool opportunities.

TUSD is working to reverse enrollment trends by:

- Improving customer service
- Expanding student transportation options, and
- Proactive recruitment of students and families.

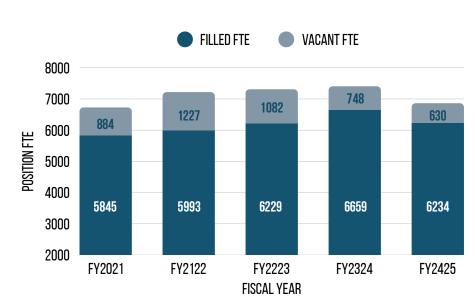


#### **OPTIMIZING RESOURCES**

Declining enrollment and the expiration of COVID-era federal funding have resulted in decreased funding overall for TUSD positions. Over the past 12 to 18 months, our district has worked with potentially displaced employees to find other opportunities within Tucson Unified to lend their talents. As an example, Human Resources proactively recruited teacher assistants in federally-funded positions to fill critical teaching assistant positions in Exceptional Education. Additionally, the Governing Board opted to absorb interventionist positions to continue supports for students needing additional assistance.

Vacancy rates over the past five school years show a steady decline, reaching a fiveyear low at 9.2% in SY2024-25.

#### **LOWEST VACANCY RATE IN YEARS**

We are proud to share that in the 2024–2025 school year, our district's vacancy rate dropped to just 9.21% – a significant decrease from the peak of 17.1% in 2021-2022 when we were emerging from the COVID-19 pandemic. This means we had 630 vacant full-time equivalent (FTE) positions at the end of this past school year, compared to 1,227 vacant FTEs three years ago.

By reducing overall positions, we've been able to focus our hiring efforts on the most essential roles. We continue to prioritize hard-to-fill positions - such as bus drivers, food service workers, Exceptional Education teaching assistants, and specialized roles like school psychologists and therapists. This targeted approach, paired with close collaboration between Human Resources and hiring sites, has strengthened recruitment, hiring, and onboarding. We are also introducing creative hybrid positions to better meet district needs.

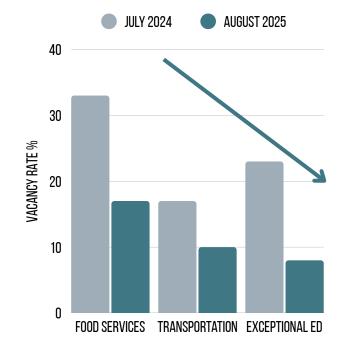


#### **TEAMWORK IN ACTION**

Over the past year, Human Resources has partnered closely with departments experiencing staffing challenges. Through targeted efforts in partnership with Food Services, Transportation, and Exceptional Education (Ex Ed), we've worked to identify solutions and remove barriers to hiring. We're proud to share the progress and positive outcomes that have resulted from this collaboration.

#### **MEASURABLE RESULTS**

During the SY2024-25, Human Resources successfully reduced vacancies in Food Services by 16%, in Transportation by 7%, and 15% in Ex Ed as of August 1, 2025.



## OUR STRATEGY

#### **01** TARGETED COMPENSATION AND INNOVATION

In SY2024–25, we implemented targeted compensation and position adjustments to help reduce vacancies in high-need areas.

- Increase bus driver pay to \$21.33/hour
- New Ex Ed Certified salary schedule, resulting in a pay increase of \$4,000 for most Ex Ed Teachers, and a \$10,000 to Ex Ed Self-Contained.
- Compensation adjustments to various specialized Food Services roles.
- Introduction of flexible hybrid positions for School Psychologists and Speech Language Pathologists (SLPs).

#### **02** EXPANDED RECRUITMENT

This year, we broadened our recruitment efforts by leveraging various strategies, including engaging our retiree pool for specialized skills, using online platforms like Indeed and LinkedIn, partnering with local colleges, and collaborating with various community organizations to attract a larger pool of applicants.

We also amplified recruitment through targeted use of social media campaigns, maintained financial incentives – including 250 stipends for hard-to-fill roles – and continued an aggressive international hiring effort. These coordinated strategies have helped reduce vacancy rates in key district areas.

#### REMOVING BARRIERS, GROWING TALENT

As part of a broader strategy to address staffing shortages in critical areas within Exceptional Education (Ex Ed), Human Resources has taken a proactive, multipronged approach to strengthen recruitment and retention. We have also worked to build a sustainable pipeline of qualified mental health professionals, by investing in hiring interns, externs, and clinician support specialists.

Working together we were able to implement changes to make high-need roles - such as Ex Ed Teacher Assistants - more accessible and attractive to candidates. These efforts included covering the cost of the ParaPro exam and extending work schedules to 7 or 7.5 hours per day, allowing these positions to qualify for full-time benefits.

Additionally, anticipating the impact expiring ESSER funds would have, we proactively engaged affected employees to offer continued employment in critical Ex Ed TA roles - helping retain experienced staff while addressing vacancies in hard-to-fill positions.

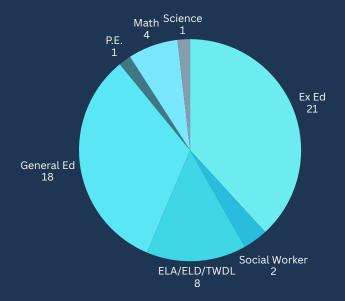

#### **02** PROVIDING CLASSROOM SUPPORT

In order to help address Ex Ed Teacher staffing shortages, Human Resources has worked with the Ex Ed to provide long-term Substitute Teachers and supported the utilization of contracted teachers, ensuring continuity of services to students.



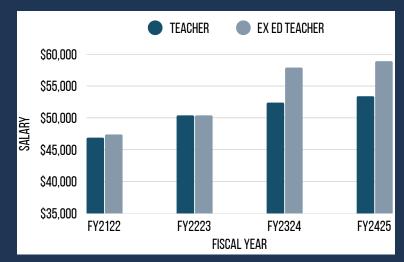
#### **DRIVING RETENTION**

When it comes to retention, compensation is definitely a factor. As such, TUSD has taken intentional steps to strengthen this area over the past several school years. We engaged compensation experts to conduct a district-wide review of salaries and classifications, resulting in pay increases for employees in roles that were below 90% of market value. We've also implemented targeted raises for hard-to-fill, high-need positions, and provided several one-time stipends to help recognize and retain our dedicated staff.

While compensation is a meaningful way to recognize the dedication of our employees, we also understand the financial limitations we face as a district. To help address this, TUSD will be seeking voter support in the fall for a budget override that would generate \$45 million over seven years. If successful, this money will help fund critical school programs and support salary increases for our employees.

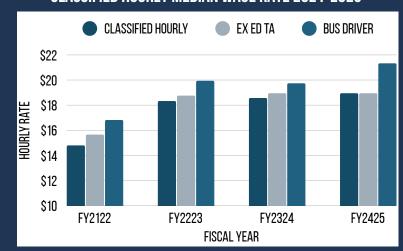
But retention isn't just about the paycheck. There are other ways we can show up for employees. As we navigate a landscape of limited resources, we remain committed to showing our employees they are valued. In fact, this moment presents an opportunity to place a greater focus on the many other factors that drive retention.

Median teacher salaries have steadily increased over the past four years, with a strong focus on boosting compensation for Ex Ed in the last two years.

Classified hourly wages have risen by approximately \$4 or more since SY2021-22, with bus drivers now earning some of the highest wages overall.

#### **BEYOND THE PAYCHECK**

In Human Resources, we know that employee benefits play a crucial role in attracting, retaining, and supporting a thriving workforce. Because of this, we work hard on curating a robust benefits package for TUSD employees and their dependents to enjoy. Over the past year, we've explored meaningful ways to enhance employee well-being, and we're proud to share the progress and outcomes of those efforts.

Our benefits package includes traditional offerings like medical, dental, and vision coverage, along with life and pet insurance, plus wellness incentives to support a healthy lifestyle. For the fourth consecutive year, our Governing Board has approved funding to help offset rising health insurance premiums for employees. Currently, over 6,744 employees and their dependents are enrolled in TUSD's benefits program.

## OUR PRIORITIES

#### **01** STABILIZING YOUR BENEFITS

The Governing Board once again passed the recommendation for the Employee Benefits Trust to subsidize rising employee premium costs, keeping employee deductions flat since 2021.

Thanks to a contribution of approximately \$1.1 million, the Employee Benefits Trust (EBT) will cover the FY2025 increase and absorb the FY2024 subsidy, ensuring our employees do not experience a rise in premiums for the upcoming school year.



#### 02 LEADING WITH PAID PARENTAL LEAVE

We're proud to lead the way as the first district among our peers to offer employees up to 12 weeks of district-paid parental leave – a bold step forward in supporting our workforce and reinforcing our commitment to being a top workplace.

Paid Parental Leave has become a valuable benefit for our employees. It has provided new parents with the opportunity to bond with their child without the added stress of lost income. During this first year, we've already seen 52 employees enjoy this benefit, which reflects how meaningful and supportive it has been during such an important life event.

#### **ENHANCING EMPLOYEE WELL-BEING**

We're excited to launch TUSD's new partnership with WellStyles! In the year ahead, employees can look forward to expanded wellness offerings – including virtual events, in-person challenges, nutritional support, and more.

## CAREER GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT GROW YOUR OWN & ASPIRING LEADERS

Like many districts nationwide, Tucson Unified School District faces a shortage of qualified applicants. To continue meeting the needs of our schools and community, we've reimaged the way we attract and grow talent. Through creative outreach efforts and encouraging participation in programs such as Grow Your Own Pathways and Aspiring Leader programs - we are supporting both recruitment and retention from within.

### **GROW YOUR OWN PROGRAMS**

#### **MAKE THE MOVE**

Available for Exceptional Education, General Education, and Two-Way Dual Language - Make the Move is designed to inspire, support, and reward current TUSD employees interested in becoming a certified teacher in high-need areas at TUSD.

- One-time signing bonus of \$5,000
- \$2,500 paid upon completion of Fall & Spring semester
- Tuition Reimbursement up to \$5,000 over two years for approved classes
- Additional stipends during the 4-year commitment: Year One - \$1,000, Year Two -\$1,000, Year Three - \$2,000, Year Four - \$1,000.

#### **U OF A FELLOWS PROGRAM**

This fellowship gives districts the opportunity to select student teachers from within their own schools, offering financial support through stipends and potential tuition coverage - helping future educators launch their careers right where they trained.

TUSD has an agreement in place with local universities that allows teachers to earn a master's degree at a reduced cost while working full time. Advance your career while gaining real-world experience.

#### **TOP-RATED WORKPLACES**

#### **CREATING A STRONGER WORKPLACE**

As we examine our FY2024-25 data, we see an overall attrition rate of 15.9%, with retirements accounting for just 2.3% of departures. This means most attrition stems from other factors, highlighting the critical need to strengthen retention efforts across all employee groups.

To deepen our understanding, and with support from the Assessment and Evaluation Department, we will gather similar data from non-school-based employees next year. This will help us capture staff sentiment districtwide and guide our ongoing retention strategies.
